Ms Beth Thomson Director

Beth is Head of Performing Arts at Aitken College. She joined the staff seven years ago after many years training with and then working for Stage School Australia (formerly CPCA), where she was the Head of Drama. With CPCA, she was in charge of overseeing over 30 performances a year, as well as the Drama curriculum for all students aged 5 to 19. Beth also participated in three World Tours in



1999 (Europe), 2002 (USA) and 2008 (USA) with CPCA. She has performed at various iconic venues including Disneyland, the Lincoln Centre and various Off-Broadway theatres. In 2010 Beth was Tour Director for the Adelaide Fringe Festival Tour of *The BFG*.

Beth has a Bachelor of Arts, a Diploma of Education and in 2014 she completed her Masters in Organisational Leadership. As well as working on various Performing Arts events, including the annual Fairview and Cumberland Concerts, Beth also coordinates the primary choir, Aitken Songsters.

Beth has thoroughly enjoyed working with staff and students on High School Musical and is extremely proud of the work and effort each cast and crew member has put in to creating this show.

Director's Note

Taking on any musical is a daunting task. Over the years, I have worked on and witnessed the many outstanding shows that have been produced at the College and I was determined to ensure that this year's production would continue the high level of performance quality Aitken is known for. When selecting a musical, there are various factors that need to be considered; technical and set requirements are always practical concerns, and cast, band/orchestra requirements can influence decision making. However, for me, it is the skills that the show encourages and the impact of the experience for students, that ultimately effects the decision. This show demanded something of our students that is different to other shows. The ability to entertain an audience with numbers that are so familiar is no easy task – the audience come in with an

expectation that you need to meet and then exceed. I am more than proud of how the cast and band have approached this. They have worked hard on the vocals, choreography and 'Disney' spark – skills that have been developed over months and months of rehearsal and dedication.

The original movie was released in 2006 and was hugely successful – in fact High School Musical spent a total of two weeks at No. 1 on the Billboard 200 chart. The stage version first toured in 2007 and has since toured the world, again with huge success. Without a doubt, our version of the show has presented some exciting challenges, partly because the cast and band were so familiar with the movie; and there are numerous differences in the plot and musical numbers, as well as additional characters. We also have a number of 'newbies' in the cast who are making their Aitken College Musical debut this year, which is especially exciting. These students are fortunate to have been guided by our senior students who have shown outstanding leadership and support.

I feel extremely grateful to work with such a knowledgeable and willing production team. Mr Michael Cooper has been a wonderful support this year and Ms Kerri Batch as always, runs a tight ship backstage which is much appreciated. Thank you to Ms Chris Pocervina, Ms Jacquelyne Armstrong and Ms Laura-Anne Portella who have all worked with the cast on building various physical skills essential for this show. I would like to give particular thanks to Mr Nicholas Frampton for his outstanding musical guidance and Ms Stephanie Pace who has had to fill many shoes this year including vocal coach, assistant Director and backstage crew. She has truly been my right-hand man and I thank her for all her support and work. Mrs Gail Sims and Ms Jacqueline Flood, have again worked their costume/make up/hair magic and Mr Daniel Pedersen and Mr Tom Thorneycroft have delivered everything I required for the various technical and set aspects of the show. Without their wisdom and hard work, the show would simply not go on.



Mr Nicholas Frampton Musical Director

Nick is an accomplished saxophonist, clarinettist and conductor with more than 25 years' experience. He graduated from Monash University with a Bachelor of Music and Graduate Diploma of Education, and more recently from Deakin University with a Master's degree in Education. Nick currently holds the position of Head of Music at Aitken College.

This is Nick's second show as MD at Aitken College; having debuted with *Footloose* last year. Nick has conducted many musicals before including *Annie*, *The Pirates of Penzance*, *Little Shop of Horrors*, *Alice in Wonderland* and *The Wizard of Oz*.

Nick began his conducting career at the age of 15 and has since conducted several major ensembles including the Monash University Philharmonic Orchestra and Monash University Symphonic Winds.

Musical Director's Note

Well, here we are again. Hard to believe it's been 12 months already. It's fair to say that over the course of preparing for a musical there are times when you ask yourself 'why do I put myself through this every year?'. It's certainly not for the dozens and dozens of hours of rehearsals spent playing just 90 minutes of music on repeat or being the last car out of the car park long after the sun has gone down.

No, as I reflect upon the journey that has brought me to this performance, I recall the talking, the chatting, the laughing, the frustration... the sound of learning together; this is why I put myself through this each year. It's fascinating to watch the students as they practice their parts, growing little by little with each rehearsal. It's empowering to watch them take the skills taught in class and apply them. It's inspiring to see them grow as young men and women; developing confidence and cultivating social skills. And that's the great thing about music. It's not just the dots on the page, it's about developing the whole person; teaching the students skills for life.

So, whilst you came to this performance with the intention of seeing a musical, know that you're not just witnessing a musical performance, you're witnessing a significant moment in the development of the lives of these young men and women. These are the memories that these children will take away from their schooling.

It's been an absolute pleasure to work with each and every one of them this year and I'm proud of their dedication and the hard work that they have put in over many months. I hope that you enjoy the show.

Roberto has involved himself heavily in the Performing Arts scene of the College through his senior years. He has been involved in numerous Music events as both a singer and guitar player.

This is his first time being involved in a College Musical and he is thankful for the opportunity to play such a good role. He has enjoyed building his confidence in both acting and singing and is grateful for the massive support he has received from the cast. Roberto also

feels that the stagecraft skills he has developed through Year 12 VET Music Performance have been useful in developing his role in the musical.

Sharpay EvansKaylee made her Aitken College Musical debut in 2016, when she played one of the Daughters in *The* \preceq Pirates of Penzance. Since then she has caught the performing bug. She was given a main role in last year's musical *Footloose* playing Urleen and was elected Performing Arts Captain of Dunhelen. Kaylee has trained with the Australian Girls' Choir for 2 years and has taken up private vocal tuition.

Chad Danforth

Kurtis has been performing for ten years after beginning Music Theatre at Centrestage in 2008 and making his stage debut with The Production Company's Mame (2008). He then toured with the Australian professional production of Mary Poppins (2010-2011, 2012) as well as joining the cast for the world premiere of Andrew Lloyd-Weber's Love Never Dies (2011). In 2013 he was cast in the Melbourne season of Chitty Chitty Bang Bang. This is Kurtis' fifth Aitken Musical after playing The Ugly Duckling in Honk!

Synopsis

On the front steps of East High, it's the first day after winter break. The Jocks, Brainiacs, Thespians and Skater Dudes find their cliques, recount their vacations, and look forward to the new year. In Ms Darbus' homeroom, basketball team captain Troy discovers that Gabriella, a girl he met singing karaoke on his ski trip, has just enrolled at East High. When he calls her, the eccentric drama teacher quickly confiscates all cell phones and assigns detention.

Between classes, Gabriella and Troy look at the audition sign-up for the school musical, but the drama diva Sharpay discourages them. At basketball practice, Troy tries to shake his desire to sing at the urging of his best friend Chad. Taylor, the science club president, discovers Gabriella's intelligence and encourages her to join the upcoming science decathlon. While the students learn how to "act" at detention, Troy's dad, Coach Bolton, faces off with Ms Darbus – his star players can't miss practice for Friday's championship game!

The next day, hopeful Thespians strut their stuff for Ms Darbus but they're no match for Sharpay and her twin brother Ryan. Troy and Gabriella arrive too late to audition, but Kelsi, the show's composer, plays the song her way and encourages them to sing. Ms Darbus overhears and gives them a callback.

News spreads fast. Sharpay is furious, and some students try to break out of their cliques during lunch. Troy and Gabriella escape to the rooftop garden and share a little bit about their real selves. The Jocks and Brainiacs devise a plan to trick Troy and Gabriella into forgetting about the musical and committing to their respective competitions.

Thinking each one has betrayed the other, Gabriella and Troy are crushed. Against Ryan's advice, Sharpay convinces Ms Darbus to move the callbacks to conflict with the science decathlon and championship game. Chad and Taylor put their heads together to make things right again. While the Jocks and Brainiacs compete, Sharpay and Ryan pull off a polished callback performance. When Taylor's laptop shuts down the electricity, Troy and Gabriella rush to the theatre, but are too late. However, when the East High students arrive to rally behind them, Ms Darbus relents, and they sing their way into the lead roles.

Back at the gym, the Wildcats win the game and the whole school comes together as winners.




