Ms Beth Thomson Director & Choreographer

Beth is Head of Performing Arts at Aitken College. She joined the staff nine years ago after many years training with and then working for Stage School Australia (formerly CPCA), where she was the Head of Drama. With CPCA, she was in charge of overseeing over 30 performances a year, as well as the Drama curriculum for all students aged 5 to 19. Beth has a Bachelor of Arts, a Diploma of Education and in 2014 she completed her Masters in Organisational Leadership. As well as working on various Performing Arts events, including the annual Fairview and Cumberland Concerts and the Emerging Performer's Showcase, Beth also coordinates the primary choir, Aitken Songsters and the College's private music instrumental program.

Although there were a few hurdles to overcome (covid safe restrictions and guidelines), Beth is so proud of this show; a testament to the dedication, motivation and effort of both the students and staff.



Ms Robyn Cole Musical Director

Robyn grew up on the north west coast of Tasmania and her indoctrination into the wonderful world of music commenced at a very young age. As well as learning piano she also played in the local brass band under the watchful eye of her ever present and encouraging father. Said parent also contributed to her ability to sight read music through his many musical endeavours outside of the band, including but not limited to weekly playing for old time dances at a local hall.

Post Uni (where she obtained a Bachelor degree in Performing Arts) she began teaching piano and voice at local schools and colleges and has not stopped since. She also has been prolific in accompanying musical theatre productions since the age of 16, and has been Vocal Director and Musical Director for shows such as *Jesus Christ Superstar, Spamalot, 13 The Musical* and *Disney's Camp Rock*. During her time at Aitken, where she is both school accompanist and an instrumental tutor, she has performed in the band for *Footloose* (2017) and *Disney's High School Musical* (2018) and was Musical Director for *Monty Python's Spamalot* (2019).

As the old adage says 'the show must go on!', and so on it shall go! We have worked together, as a team, to get this musical ready for an audience and we could not be happier to see it on our CPA stage in lights. It has been an intense, busy and rewarding couple of weeks trying to pull this show together, but the energy has been infectious and I am so happy to see the students feel this sense of achievement.

We were fortunate to have the Musical Camp to Lake Dewar go ahead this year. This three day intensive program during the Term 1 school holidays laid the foundations for us to build upon. It was over this time, that we were able to knuckle down into rehearsals, and spend time not only working on our vocals and choreography. We were also able to set goals and expectations so the that we were all on the same path to show success.

As always, we were faced with some exciting challenges (that were not actually pandemic related!). Firstly, this show was originally scheduled to be performed last year under the direction of veteran Mr Michael Cooper, and its postponement was a disappointment for our College community. I therefore had big shoes to fill this year. My goal was to ensure the students achieved their absolute best and they have not disappointed – their commitment and energy has been impressive.

Secondly, The Addams family are well known personalities; although the story line for this show is not familiar, the characters all are. Our students had to work hard on ensuring the characters became their own, yet identifiable and maintained their familiarity.

We have a number of 'newbies' in the cast and band who are making their Aitken College Musical debut, which is especially exciting and it has been rewarding to see these students develop their performance skills. As with each year, the younger students are fortunate to have been guided by our older, senior students who yet again have been wonderful mentors, demonstrating outstanding leadership and support.

I feel extremely grateful to work with such an experienced and energetic production team. Mr Michael Cooper has provided consistent encouragement and support and, this year, has ensured that backstage works like clockwork. Thank you to Ms Jacquelyne Armstrong who worked with the cast on building dance and movement skills. Her choreographic assistance was invaluable. We are so fortunate to have a strong and talented musical team. Headed by Ms Robyn Cole, along with Mr Glen Impey and Mr Victor Brincat, these staff members have worked tirelessly with the orchestra. Their guidance has ensured that the students have felt supported and confident with this musical score.

Again, Mrs Gail Sims and Ms Jacqueline Flood, have worked miracles, seemingly reading my mind with the costume, make up and hair designs. Mr Daniel Pedersen and Ms Rezz Ufacikligil have gone above and beyond, working a huge set and ensuring that technically, we had everything that we needed. Their knowledge and guidance has been not only greatly appreciated, but essential.

He is currently undertaking Drama classes at school and has enjoyed his first involvement in a College Co-curricular activity. He is grateful that he hasn't had to learn any lines and enjoys playing the strong silent type!







After visiting the graveyard to celebrate 'what it is to be an Addams', Uncle Fester stops the Ancestors' from returning to their graves to enlist their help. He explains that Wednesday, under protest, has invited her new (normal) boyfriend, Lucas Beineke, and his parents, Mal and Alice, to dinner.

As the Beinekes arrive, Wednesday and Lucas instruct their families to act normal so they can all enjoy a simple dinner, but the moment Lurch ushers the Beinekes into the mansion, tensions begin to mount. After wearing black for eighteen years, Wednesday appears in a bright yellow dress. Later, Lucas and Wednesday, away from their families, reveal that the reason they brought their families together is to announce their marriage. Gomez and Mal share a drink and Alice admits to Morticia that her marriage to Mal has grown passionless. Meanwhile, Pugsley is worried that Wednesday's love life means she won't torture him anymore. He steals a potion from Grandma after she reveals it will bring out someone's dark nature. Pugsley plans to slip it to Wednesday at dinner.

At dinner, "The Game" is played, where each person at the table confesses something. In a mix-up, Alice drinks Pugsley's potion and in front of everyone declares her marriage to Mal a loveless mess as she reveals her misery and woe. As Mal, humiliated, attempts to leave with his family, Wednesday announces that she and Lucas will marry. Chaos engulfs both families, and Uncle Fester, trying to be helpful, instructs the Ancestors to create a sudden, terrible storm, trapping everyone in the mansion for the night.

During the storm, Wednesday tries to leave, but Lucas wants to stay and work things out with their families, leading the pair to have their first fight. Later, Morticia fears she is no longer relevant to her own family, and reminds herself that death is waiting for her. Mal and Alice start to have a fight about their marriage at the dinner after Alice makes a poem that doesn't rhyme. Uncle Fester calls for an interlude as he plays his ukulele, singing a love song to the Moon.

Walking out in the yard, Wednesday runs into Gomez. He is happy she's found someone to love, yet sad that his daughter is growing up. Wednesday is left worrying that she and Lucas are too different. Then as a show of trust, Lucas blindfolds Wednesday and lets her shoot an apple off his head with a crossbow. She succeeds, and the two embrace.

In the grotto, Gomez and Fester attempt to get Mal to open up about his feelings to no avail. Mal, has learned to appreciate what he has and announces he still loves Alice. Gomez goes up to the rooftop to profess his love for Morticia; they kiss and begin to tango.

With all the couples reunited, Pugsley admits to slipping the potion to Alice, but is congratulated since it brought everyone together. Uncle Fester, wearing a rocket, tells everyone he is flying off to be with the moon. As the families sing one last ballad, they are all shocked as Lurch sings out loud for the first time, just as a puff of smoke is seen on the moon, signaling Fester has landed.

Before moving from Ballarat to take up the position at Aitken, Michael loved to stage manage and is happy to be back in this role. He is currently Director of Performing Arts and Drama Co-ordinator in the College.
